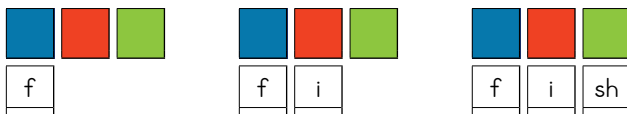


# Using Letter Tile Free Play to Practice Spelling Words

**Letter Tile Free Play** can be used to practice spelling your child's single-syllable spelling words in a way that makes the words' sound-spelling connections clear.

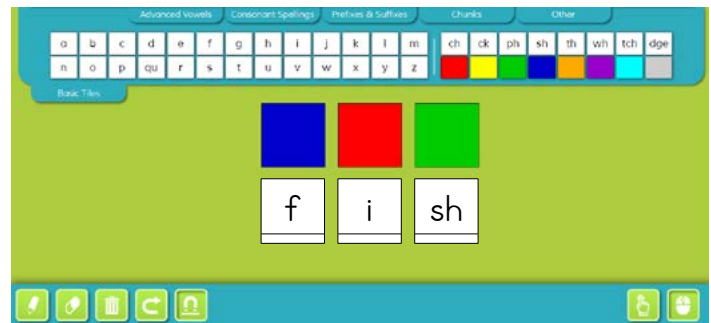
## Procedure

- Tell your child the spelling word, say it in a contextual sentence, and then say the word again.
  - Fish** – Our pet **fish** just swims in circles. **Fish**.
- Your child should then segment, or separate, the sounds in the word using finger-stretching, or stretching out one finger for each sound, beginning with the thumb. This will tell them how many sounds, not letters, are in the word.
  - /f/ /i/ /sh/, fish – **3** sounds
- Using the color tiles in Letter Tile Free Play, your child should pull down a color tile for each sound they hear in the word. We typically use the red tile to represent the vowel sound in the word.
- Using the letter tiles, your child should spell each sound they heard, one at a time.

When a sound is spelled with more than one letter (ex: /sh/ is spelled with the letters **s** and **h**), they should use just one letter tile to represent that sound. The number of color tiles should match the number of letter tiles.

## Examples of Other Words

SPELLING WORD	CONTEXTUAL SENTENCE	LETTER TILE SETUP
<b>thin</b>	The stick I found was <b>thin</b> , not thick.	
<b>shell</b>	We found a shiny <b>shell</b> on the beach.	
<b>bring</b>	Please <b>bring</b> the plate over here.	
<b>heard</b>	I've <b>heard</b> that song before.	
<b>stood</b>	I <b>stood</b> up when she called my name.	

Pull single-syllable words from the spelling lists correlated with your child's instructional program.

\* The 'll' letter tile is found in the Consonant Spellings tab in Letter Tile Free Play.

\* The 'ing' tile can be found in the Chunks tab in Letter Tile Free Play.

\* The 'ear' tile can be found in the Advanced Vowels tab in Letter Tile Free Play.

\* The 'oo' tile can be found in the Advanced Vowels tab in Letter Tile Free Play.
