# Using Letter Tile Free Play to Practice Spelling Words



Letter Tile Free Play can be used to practice spelling your child's single-syllable spelling words in a way that makes the words' sound-spelling connections clear.

#### Procedure

- 1. Tell your child the spelling word, say it in a contextual sentence, and then say the word again.
  - Fish Our pet fish just swims in circles. Fish.
- 2. Your child should then segment, or separate, the sounds in the word using finger-stretching, or stretching out one finger for each sound, beginning with the thumb. This will tell them how many sounds, not letters, are in the word.
  - /f/ /i/ /sh/, fish **3** sounds
- Using the color tiles in Letter Tile Free Play, your child should pull down a color tile for each sound they hear in the word. We typically use the red tile to represent the vowel sound in the word.
- 4. Using the letter tiles, your child should spell each sound they heard, one at a time.



When a sound is spelled with more than one letter (ex: /sh/ is spelled with the letters  $\mathbf{s}$  and  $\mathbf{h}$ ), they should use just one letter tile to represent that sound. The number of color tiles should match the number of letter tiles.
